- General Updates
  - AI
    - OSTP came to CCC and asked us to organize one of four workshops
    - Short 8 min talks- everyone had good examples
    - Had around 300 folks in the room, 3,500 online
    - Organizing committee is now working on a short 6-8 page report, will hopefully have something out by early July
    - Blog post already out
  - NRI
    - 5<sup>th</sup> year of the National Robotics Initiative
    - Set of demos that they brought in
    - Very popular, at least 100-150 people in the room during the panel discussion
    - Hill staffers were extremely impressed
    - People care about robotics but it would be nice to see more funding

    - What is the status of white paper writing and other task force activities?
    - We current have 2 papers written and have 1 more queued. Also under discussion are papers covering the topics of autonomous vehicles, health and CitPW, and data implications of CitPW.

    - We envision that the current 3 papers cover most of the content needed for possible transition papers. We have also discussed additional people to invite to participate in writing papers on related topics.

- Security - nexus of security + privacy + safety

- Health / intersection with Health task force

The above white papers could be harnessed for transition papers.

- If you were to host a roundtable or workshop this fall oriented to complementing current papers, what might that look like?

We proposed a panel at the AAAS 2017 session/panel proposal on Accelerating Science (aimed at the broader scientific community) We have a AAAI Fall symposium (aimed more at the AI/CS research community) scheduled on the same topic.

It makes sense to consider hosting an additional roundtable/workshop. I have a call scheduled with Chaitan Baru to explore what makes the most sense.

- At what speed is your task force operating (full throttle, cruise control, idling)?

Somewhere between cruise control and idling, depending on when you ask.

- If you could recruit 1-2 non-council members to participate as part of your task force, who would that be?

It would really depend on how the task force evolves. It might make sense to spin off a separate "Computing" task force. If we do that, perhaps "Data" could be folded into the "AI" task force ("Data" featured prominently in all of the sessions of the CCC "AI for social good" workshop earlier this month).

Here is the report on the new Chinese machine, a 125 peak PF system with a Linpack benchmark of 93 PF. It has a custom ARM core and an impressive energy efficiency number (but not much memory per node). It also seems to have 3 large science applications running on it, so more usable than some of the previous systems.
