

### 2020 PRESIDENTIAL RACE







#### 2020 SENATE RACE


- Tillis (R-NC) and Sullivan (R-AK) not called yet, but likely
- GA runoff for both seats





#### 2020 SENATE RACES - KEY RESULTS

- Sen. Cory Gardner (R-CO) loses to former Gov John Hickenlooper (D)
- Sen. Lamar Alexander (R-TN) retires, replaced by Bill Hagerty (R)
- Sen. Gary Peters (D-MI) retains seat over John James (R)
- Narrow majority will provide three Senate moderates with leverage



### 2020 HOUSE RACE

- Demsprojected to hold House
- Net -5 atm





#### 2020 HOUSE RACES - KEY RESULTS

- House Science, Space and Tech Chair and Ranking Member expected to remain in place
- Rep. Dan Lipinski (D-IL), 3rd ranking, defeated in primary
- Rep. Kendra Horn (D-OK), Chair of Space and Aeronautics subcom defeated
- Rep. Haley Stevens (D-MI), current Chair Research and Tech subcom, narrowly wins
- Rep. Will Hurd (R-TX), retires
- House dynamics could be fractious on majority side (Tea Party echoes) with progressive v. moderate wing



#### "MANDATE" FOR THE PRESIDENT-ELECT?

- He'll argue yes Could finish with 306 electoral votes (same as Trump v. Clinton)
- Popular vote margin > 4 million votes
- Down-ballot votes held for GOP though (Trump underperformed GOP Senate candidates in competitive states)
- I think the dominant force will be a push to the center
- Could bode well for some notable research initiatives, but could also curb overall spending

- Coronavirus Stimulus
  - Compromise measure?
- Funding Government December 11th deadline; Trump hasn't indicated whether he'd sign a new deal
- Coronavirus Task Force (Biden names today)
  - Includes Zeke Emmanuel keynoted a CCC workshop on Robotics for Infectious Disease
- Transition team....



#### TRANSITION TEAM

- Has been at work since June (legally required)
- Chaired by former Sen. Ted Kauffman (D-DE), with a number of co-chairs and a big advisory board, including Pete Buttigieg, Sally Yates, Susan Rice, and Cindy McCain
- John Holdren, Tom Kalil, likely many others from Obama's tight-knit OSTP are/will be advising on science issues
- Reportedly already "discussing possible candidates for jobs in health and science agencies, though campaign officials stress no decisions have been made."
- Likely to reach across the aisle for some appointments
- Keep eyes/ears open for rumored appointees and get them Quad Papers :-)
